AJG: How is professional golf different from college/amateur golf for you?

AM: It all about learning to get comfortable again and remembering that it's just golf and I'm just trying to get a little white ball in the hole. Also, learning what to do will all of my time without classes - it's golf fulltime now.

AJG: What is your practice routine like?

AM: On a normal day I spend 30 minutes putting then 1 hour chipping, hit balls for half an hour, chipping and putting again for an hour before another 30 minutes of putting to finish up.

AJG: What is it like playing on some of the biggest stages in golf?

AM: The Walker Cup was the most nervous I have ever been - shaking, breathing heavy. Four thousand people were on the first tee, there to watch me play golf, I don't even know them and they are depending on me to play well for the U.S. It's different when a team is depending on you, like college you have guys in front of and behind you counting on you to play well.

AJG: What's upcoming in golf for you?

AM: Playing in professional tournaments, Hooters/NGA, Nationwide Tour events and PGA Tour Qualifying School in October, 2009.

AJG: What was your experience with AJG?

AM: I just wanted to win medals, it took me a while and it started slow... none at first then 3rd and 2nd place finishes. Finally my last season I won 5 of my 6 events. It's worked like that on my way until now, starting slow in junior or amateur golf working your way up the ladder at each level. I hope it continues to work that way at the pro level.

AJG: What's one of your favorite golf memories?

AM: The Walker Cup, Winning SEC Team Championship as a senior in 2009 and winning my first AJG medal!
